Charles and Bernard came to us on June 1st, 2021. After purchasing a farm in western NH in late 2020 we knew that we needed some dogs to protect any livestock we wanted to keep. Western NH is still a very rural place with many predators. I was actually very unfamiliar with LGD breeds in general and didn't really know what I was looking for but I remember seeing a picture of a Great Pyrenees years ago and thinking about how majestic and beautiful they are. I started looking online in early spring of 2021 for puppies and stumbled across a puppy site which then linked me to Seeking Shalom Acres.
